FINAL PUBLIC HEARING ADOPT MILLAGE RATE/ PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FY 2020/2021 SEPTEMBER 24, 2020

The Town of Haverhill's final Public Hearing for the 2020/2021 FY millage rate and budget was held at the Town Hall, 4585 Charlotte Street on Thursday, September 24, 2020. Those present were Jay Foy, Mayor; Lawrence Gordon, Vice Mayor; Dennis Withington, Council Member and Ray Caranci, Council Member. Also present were Lance Fuchs, Town Attorney; and Janice C. Rutan, Town Administrator.

The Public Hearing was being held via teleconference for persons wanting to participate.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Foy called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Foy offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

All Town Council members were in attendance except for Council Member Uptegraph.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC (items not on the agenda)

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

There being no additions, deletions or substitutions, a motion was made by Vice Mayor Gordon, seconded by Council Member Withington, and unanimously passed (4-0) to approve the agenda as presented.

Adopt millage rate for Fiscal Year October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021 Resolution R2020-09: A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HAVERHILL, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, LEVYING A TAX OF 4.5000 MILLS UPON THE TAXABLE NON-EXEMPT PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN OF HAVERHILL FOR THE 2020-2021 FISCAL YEAR RESULTING IN A 7.00 PERCENT INCREASE OVER THE ROLL BACK RATE OF 4.2057.

The title was read by Attorney Fuchs. The Town Administrator presented Staff's Report. Mayor Foy commented that although there was not an increase in the millage rate, there was an increase over the roll back rate.

Mayor Foy opened the floor to public comment. There being none, a motion was made by Vice Mayor Gordon, seconded by Council Member Caranci, and unanimously passed to approve Resolution R2020-09 setting the millage rate at 4.5000 mils for the FY 2020/2021.

General Fund: \$1,230,198

• Special Revenue Fund Building \$73,150

OFFICIAL MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Town Council was called to order immediately following the close of the Public Hearing.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

None.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The Town Administrator requested the approval of the minutes for the August 27, 2020 Regular Meeting be removed from the Consent Agenda.

A motion was then made by Vice Mayor Gordon, seconded by Council Member Caranci, and unanimously passed (4-0) to approve the Agenda as amended.

APPROVAL OF THE CONSENT AGENDA

Approval of the minutes of the August 13, 2020 and August 27, 2020 Regular Town Council meetings and August 4, 2020 and September 1, 2020 Workshop minutes.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor Gordon, seconded by Council Member Withington, and unanimously passed (4-0) to approve the Consent Agenda as amended.

PROCLAMATIONS AND PRESENTATION

None.

COMMENTS FROM THE PALM BEACH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

There were no representatives from PBSO present at the Town Council meeting, however, the Town Administrator announced that Lt. Terrance Carn would be present at the October 6, 2020 workshop along with representatives from the PBC Fire Rescue.

REGULAR AGENDA AND FIRST READINGS

Consider request of Sheryl Snider, property owner of 1141 Cheryl Road to remove the assessed lien against her property in the amount of \$3,500.

Devon Kirms, Code Inspector was present via teleconference call. She had presented Staff's report. It was Staff's recommendation that Town Council not reduce the assessed lien against Ms. Snyder in the amount of \$3,500 as Staff had determined that between three Code Officers, Attorney/Court time and expenses, the Town had expended \$3,500 in costs.

Ms. Snyder was present and addressed the Town Council. She had sent a letter asking for the fine to be reduced as she believed she had complied with the cited violations. It was explained that on June 16, 2020 an affidavit of compliance had been issued as she in fact had complied with the violations that had resulted in the lien, however, the lien had been active since February 10, 2020 and continued to accrue until compliance.

It was explained to Ms. Snyder that the matter before the Town Council was only for their consideration to reduce the lien. They were not the body to determine guilt or innocence. Ms. Snyder argued that she had simply done what she had been told to do by the former Code Officer. Again, it was explained that the case had already been heard by the Special Magistrate and the Town Council was not in the position to retry the case.

In response to her inquiry, Attorney Fuchs responded that an appeal of the decision of the Town Council would be made to the Circuit Court.

Discussion ensued and a motion was made by Vice Mayor to offer Ms. Snyder a settlement in the amount of \$2,000 to be paid within 30 days and if not paid within the 30 days, the amount due will revert to \$3,500.

It was noted that the offer made by Council was extremely generous.

The motion was seconded by Council Withington and unanimously passed (4-0).

Appoint members to the Infrastructure Surtax Committee

The Town Administrator presented Staff's report. On November 8, 2016, the voters of Palm Beach County approved a one-percent local government infrastructure surtax to be used by the County, Palm Beach County School Board and the municipalities within Palm Beach County for the financing, planning, constructing, reconstructing, renovating and improving needed infrastructure.

The Town of Haverhill had chosen to create its own Infrastructure Surtax Committee and had appointed 6 members to serve on the Committee. Three of the originally appointed 6 members have moved from Haverhill and are unable to serve on the committee. The remaining members are as follows:

- Joseph Alonsi
- Salesia Smith Gordon
- Betty Murph
- Tom Burns

Staff was requesting the Town Council appoint a minimum of 2 additional members so that the committee can continue to meet, as necessary.

Council Member Caranci had recommended Timothy Nye and Salesia Smith Gordon had suggested that Alicia Dixon be appointed.

Council agreed to make the appointments at the next meeting.

Confirm and ratify action of the Infrastructure Surtax Committee re: Payment of Emergency Repairs to the Briarwood Drainage Project

The Town Administrator presented Staff's report. She had met with the Infrastructure Committee on September 23, 2020 to discuss the possibility that the recent emergency repairs to the failed drainage system at Berkeley Mews by paid for with Infrastructure Surtax funds. It was the recommendation of the Surtax Committee to reimburse the Town of Haverhill General Fund \$50,999 and to pay for the emergency drainage repairs to the Briarwood Drainage system from the Infrastructure Surtax funds.

Discussion followed. A motion was then made by Council Member Caranci, seconded by Vice Mayor Gordon and unanimously passed (4-0) to accept and ratify the recommendation of the Infrastructure Sales Tax Committee and charge the cost of the repairs to the Infrastructure Sales Tax fund.

Update on Briarwood Wall Project

The Town Administrator reported that she had submitted the grant request to the Solid Waste Authority in the amount of \$29,995 for the construction of the Briarwood Wall. She explained there had been a bit of concern when she could not locate the annexation documents from when the Briarwood subdivision was annexed into the Town which showed ownership of the roads and R-O-W. It was eventually located, and the grant application was now in review.

Update to personnel Policy re: Employee Floating Holiday

The Town Administrator offered Staff's report. She explained that the Town of Haverhill's Personnel Policy calls for 12 observed holidays that full-time employees were eligible for paid holiday time off. One of those holidays was the observance of Columbus Day, traditionally held the second Monday in October.

It was her recommendation that the Town Council remove the Columbus Day from the 12 observed holidays and instead allow each employee to be granted a paid holiday of their choosing.

A motion was then made by Council Member Withington, seconded by Vice Mayor Gordon and unanimously passed (4-0) to remove the Columbus Day from the 12 observed holidays and instead allow each employee to be granted a paid holiday of their choosing through the approval of the Town Administrator.
