Those present were Mayor Jay Foy; Vice Mayor Lawrence Gordon (Via Zoom); Council Member Ray Caranci; Council Member Teresa Johnson; Town Attorney John Foster; Town Administrator Janice Rutan; Deputy Town Clerk Jean Wible; Code Inspector Rico Armstrong and Town Planner Josh Nichols.

Also in attendance was Tracey Adams, PBC Fire Rescue and Jonathan Brown, PBC Department of Housing and Economic Development.

III. NEW BUSINESS

A. Presentation by Jonathan Brown, PBC Department of Housing and Economic Development: Presentation of Sustainable Housing Programs, Palm Beach County: Director Jonathan Brown explained the responsibilities of the Department was to manage Federal, State, and Local Program Funding for Housing, Economic, and Community Development.

Director Brown reported that their primary Federal funding resource was the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development also known as HUD. However, there were several other Department resources they work with like the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), HOME Investments Partnership Program (HOME), Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP), Section 108 Loan Program,

United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Department of Energy (DOE), U.S. Department of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA), Coronavirus Aid, Relief, & Economic Security Act (CARES) and the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

State funding resources were State Housing Initiative Partnership (SHIP) and Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF).

Local funding resources were Workforce Housing Trust Fund, Ad Valorem Tax Exemption Program (AVTE) and General Fund.

Projects that are typically funded for the (CBG) Community Block Grants are Infrastructure: Drainage, Road & Resurfacing, Sanitary Sewer; Public Facilities: Parks improvements, community facilities; Public Services: Philip D. Lewis Center, Legal Aid, Seagull Industries, Aid to Victims of Domestic Abuse, Coalition for Independent Living, Urban League, Children's Place at Home Safe, Sickle Cell Foundation, Place of Hope, Vita Nova, Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies, Redlands Christian Migrant Assoc.

Director Brown presented a detailed power point and provided a pdf copy to Town Council and Staff to follow along (see attached). **Discussion ensued.**

Director Brown stated that if the Town had projects they would like to see have funded, contact him to see how they can make it happen. Town Council mentioned they would like to look into funding for changing over from septic to sewer within the Town.

B. Presentation of Annual Report by District Chief (Battalion 10) Tracey Adams, of Palm Beach County Fire Rescue: Chief Tracey Adams presented a power point of the Town of Haverhill Annual Report from October 1, 2020, through September 20, 2021. Chief Adams announced our new Fire Chief was Patrick Kennedy as Chief Reginald Duren left to accept a position working for PBC Administrator Verdenia Baker as an Assistant County Administrator. Chief Adams also provided the February 2022 Response Time Report which included 14 Medical Calls, 2 Vehicle Accidents, 1 Structure Fire, 2 Assists/Investigations and 1 Fire Alarm with a response time of 5 minutes and 54 seconds.
